Year 12 Trip to Dundonald Ice Bowl


A tremendous team building day was enjoyed by our Year 12 at Dundonald International Ice Bowl where both staff and students had a great day ice skating and bowling.

In April, St Mary's Technology Department hosted two Practical Skills Insight Days for pupils from St Joseph's Convent Primary School. Year 7 pupils were taught key practical workshop skills by Mr Morgan and Miss Meehan. The purpose of the full day programme was to introduce pupils to some of the practical skills carried out in Technology and Design classes in KS3. The STEM programme included skills such as measuring and marking out, fabrication using plastics, card and wood, and practical activities using hand tools and workshop machinery such as the pillar drill and soldering equipment. At the end of the session each pupil had produced their very own battery racer and challenged one another in a race.









Year 8 and 9 Imagineering Project

Our Year 8 and 9 students enjoyed two action packed Interactive ICT days as we hosted The Imagineering Project in collaboration with First Derivatives and The AMMA Centre. Each team used their imagination and creativity to come up with a product or service based on a standard brick. They filmed a 2-3 minute pitch using green screen technology and created a prototype app for their product. Virtual Reality Gaming

The ICT Department were delighted to welcome back past pupil Deirbhile Larkin. Deirbhile is now a student of Dundalk Institute of Technology studying computing. Along with three of her fellow students Charlie Behan, Minh Thu Le and Guion Smith, Deirbhile returned to St Mary's to test a game that the group had created for a Microsoft competition. The game was created using game development software Unreal Engine 4 and oculus rift. The rift is a virtual reality headset and uses state of the art displays and optics to transport you into the game. Both students and staff enjoyed an exciting afternoon sampling their computer game and feedback was extremely positive.

Our GCSE Home Economics students enjoyed another successful year of practicals, cooking mouthwatering starters, main courses and desserts.






Internet Safety Week


